	dismissal time.
	2. Special Students
	 A student who is identified as exceptional by
	Special Education Services or Medical
	Transportation Procedure (STOPR019) will receive
	special attention as required from driver, school
	principal and STOPR.
	 Standees are not permitted on a school bus.
	3. Maximum Number of Students Transported on a Bus
	 The number of students transported on a bus will
	not exceed the manufacturer's capacity for that
	vehicle. Where practical, bus seats will be loaded
